- Long-Range Master Plan (8 to 10 year cycle)
- Needs vs. Wants
- Student Enrollment Growth







Schedule Review



- Facility Assessment completed September 1, 2011
- Sinking Fund passed on November 5, 2013 Runs out in 2020
- LAS / TowerPinkster / OAK meetings on Feb. 8, May 1, June 19, July 9, July 19, & August 15.
- Facility Committee Meeting August 23, 2018
- Board Meeting August 27, 2018
- Community Forums: Sept. 12, Oct. 17, Nov. 7
- Board decision by Thanksgiving
- Potential Bond vote May 2019.





Assumptions & Priorities

- No millage increase!
- Allow bonding capacity for future needs
- Infrastructure needs for five years
- Every school building to receive some improvements
- Limit elementary school capacity to 600 students
- Move pre-school, for capacity at Bushnell
- Accommodate student growth at Alto
- Long-range plan for facility improvements





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Sinking Fund Projects Completed



Alto: asphalt paving, boilers

Bushnell: secure vestibule

Cherry Creek: flooring, bus canopy

Middle School: security vestibule

High School: roofing, stadium roof, secure vestibule, asphalt paving, security doors, fire alarm system

Wittenbach Center: asphalt paving

Central Office: fire alarm system, boiler

Total \$2,754,941.77



High Priority Needs

(No particular priority)

- Infrastructure:
 - General Fund/Sinking Fund Projects
- Alto Classrooms: five new lower elem.
 classrooms
- Athletic Needs: Gymnasium Space, Wrestling, Tennis, Multi-purpose Field/Lacrosse, Softball, + Baseball
- Middle School: Additions + Renovations
- Pre-school program
- Technology + Furnishings







Existing Infrastructure 1-5 years



Highest Priority Needs:

- Alto new mechanical system, air conditioning, lighting & ceilings
- **Bushnell** new mechanical system, boilers, public address system, air conditioning
- Cherry Creek roofing, exterior doors, separate office cooling, public address system
- Murray Lake new lighting control system, public address system, additional parent drop off lane
- Middle School four basketball backboards, mezzanine flooring

Alto Elementary

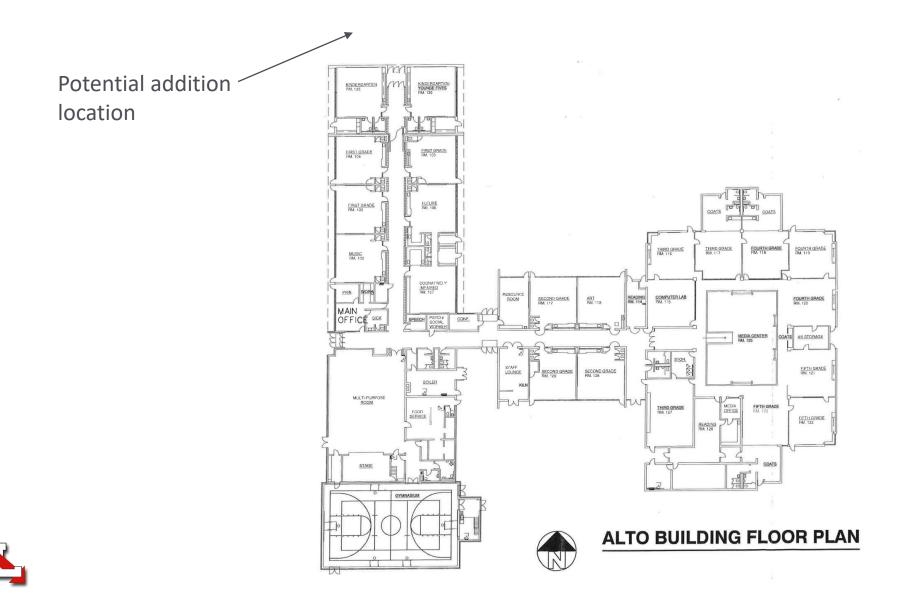
• Five classroom addition to accommodate growth







Alto Elementary – existing floor plan

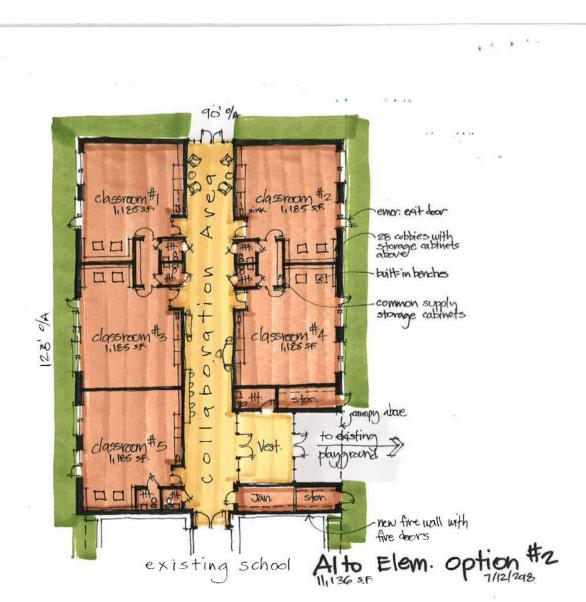


Alto Elementary Addition Concept

Five lower elementary classrooms

- Shared toilets & storage
- Classroom alcoves with cubbies
- Security vesibule, covered entrance, toilet & outdoor storage
- Central collaboration area

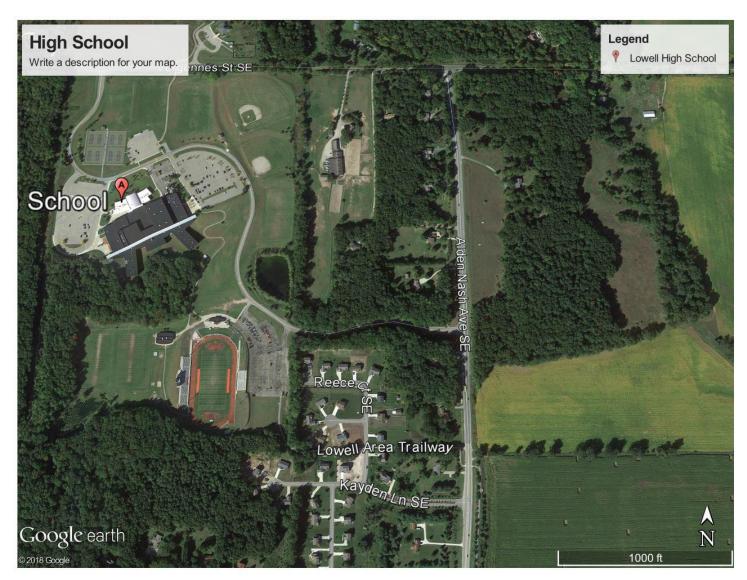

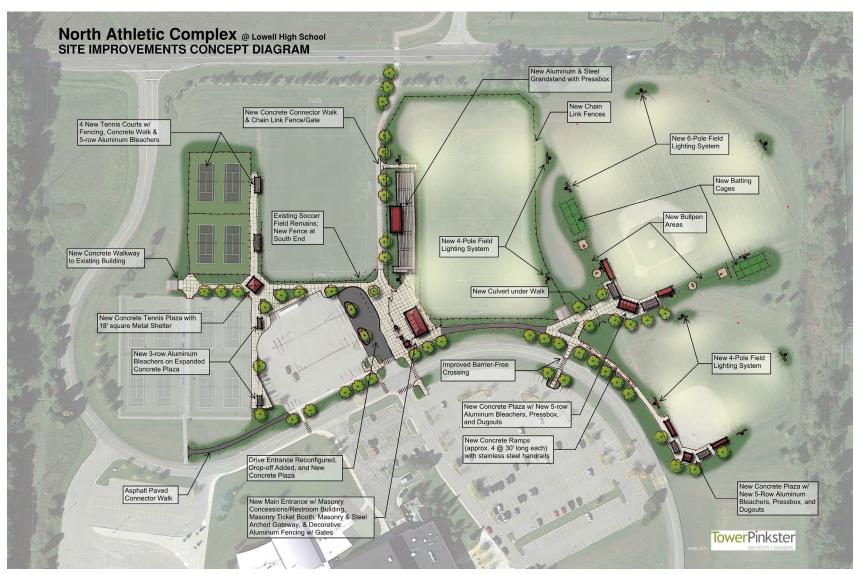






High School Athletic Needs

Tennis

4 post-tensioned concrete courts, sidewalks, bleachers and shade structure

North Athletic Fields

Synthetic Turf Field, bleachers, press box, team room, lighting & toilet building

Baseball / Softball

– Dugouts, press box, bleachers, concrete (no lighting)

Athletics sub – total

ALTERNATE Indoor Athletics (not included)

- 2,400 seat Competition Gym with wrestling, locker rooms, toilets, concession, lobby

Existing Middle School



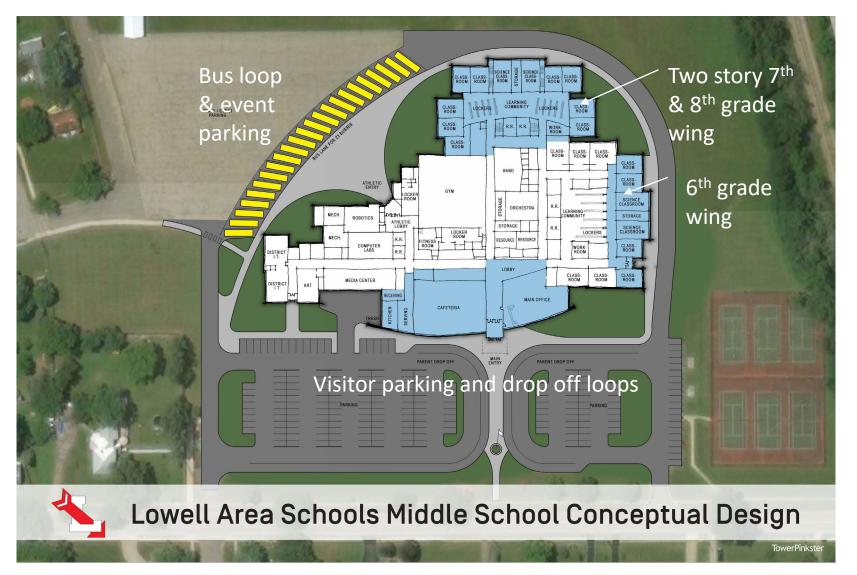
- Internal corridors are narrow and congested
- Small classrooms require major renovation and lack space for ductwork. Some lack daylight.
- Mechanical systems are at the end of their useful life
- More collaboration space for group work & hands-on projects vs. fixed layouts
- Site Circulation need better separation of buses,
 - cars and students.



Middle School Site Plan Concept

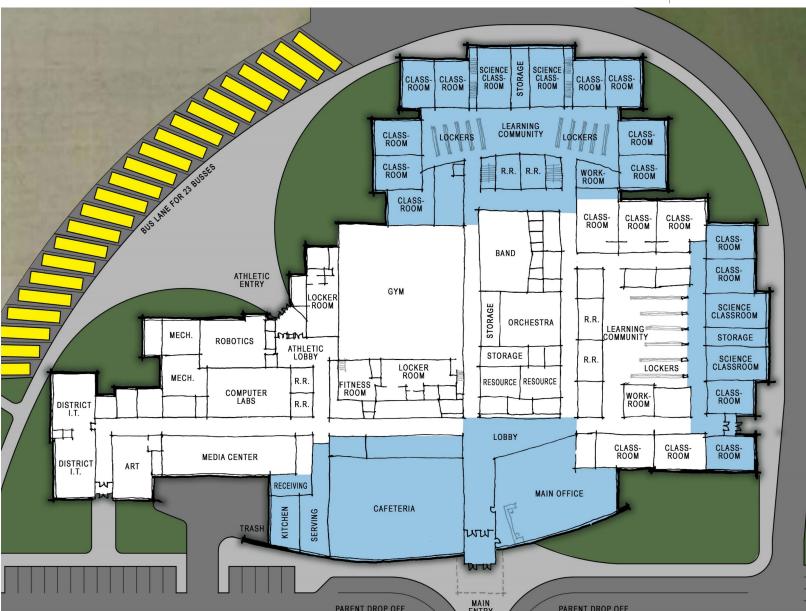


- Keep the spaces that are in good condition
- Two story classroom wing. Less site area, less disruption & shorter construction schedule for savings
- Two car drop off loops and separate bus loop
- Creates parking in front and preserves ball fields behind the school



Middle School Floor Plan Concept

- New two story classroom pods for 7th & 8th grades, renovated & new for 6th grade.
- All grade levels have a learning community and locker commons
- Larger classrooms. Most have natural daylight
- All New science labs
- Internal circulation improved
- New cafeteria with stage
- New main office / entrance

Preliminary Budget

- \$ 5.86 million
- \$ 3.5 million
- \$ 4.95 million
- \$33.2 million
 - \$ 2.0 million by owner

\$49.51 million







How successful are bond elections in Michigan?

- Over the last 20 years, State Qualified Bond issues have passed at about a 50% rate.
- Between 2012 and 2016*:
 - Bonds without an increase passed at a 91% rate
 - Bonds with an increase passed at a 59% rate

(*PFM Group – January 2017)







What are our Funding Options?

- General Fund: District has committed some items to be completed with general funds
- Sinking Fund: 7 years Ends in 2020
- **Bond Issue** provide for major improvements to district buildings without increasing taxes (zero mill increase)
